The person you phone may not be the one to fetch your prescription or bring in some shopping but they will get on to someone who will and for your security let you know the name of the person who will call. Any of these people will gladly have a chat on the phone if you need to hear a friendly voice. There are even some of us who could offer to take you to your doctors or hospital appointment if your usual lift isn't available.



Here is an excerpt from a long letter sent out on 17th March by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York,

"We, the Church of Jesus Christ, with our sisters and brothers from other Christian churches, must be in the forefront of providing practical care and support for the most poor and the most vulnerable and we offer our services to all those who are beginning to think through how best to provide for those in need." They finish their letter, "This is a defining moment for the Church of England. Are we truly a church for all, or just the church for ourselves? We urge you sisters and brothers to become a different sort of church in these coming months: hopeful and rooted in the offering of prayer and

praise and overflowing in service to the world.

Please, therefore, join us in this great challenge; and pray for our government and nation, for each other, and especially those who work in our health and emergency services."
